Year 4 parent meeting for Hill End is next Wednesday (20th March) at 3.30pm in Class 11.

Year 5 are having their Modroc Mask Day on Wednesday 27th March – parent helpers needed from 11.15am onwards. If you can help, please speak to your child's teacher.

Our trainee cyclists are out and about cycling around Ladygrove. If you see them on your travels please take care driving around them. Thank you.

Message from Network Rail: As part of our Programme to electrify key rail routes across the mainline, the section of railway near your school is under construction for the installation of the Overhead Line Equipment. The safety of people on and around the railway is our priority and education in rail safety is key, especially for young people.

The overhead lines will be energised at 25,000 volts AC, at 50Hz frequency. It is of course extremely dangerous for any person to come close to the overhead line equipment or any associated part of it, including the supporting masts, switch feeds and cables. There is no danger to any persons as long as they remain away from the railway boundary line and fencing. Please talk to your child/ren about being safe around railway lines.

Tickets for Year 4 Production this term (Wind in the Willows) will be available on Monday 18th March. Box office opens at 8.30am and tickets can be collected from the office.

There is a charge for tickets to cover our costs for licencing/scripts/music etc. Tickets are £1.50 each. If you cannot collect tickets you can email the school office or phone school requesting tickets. Due to space restrictions tickets are limited to four per child though there is a maximum of 2 tickets available in the evening. Tickets are 'first come, first served' basis. Evening tickets go very quickly – normally sold out by Tuesday!

The performances are at **1.30pm and 6.15pm on Tuesday 2nd April**.

Any tickets not collected by Friday 22nd March will be made available to parents who would like extra on Monday 25th March. Letters will go home with details about costumes. Children will need to be dropped off at 5.45pm for the evening performance. Children will go back to their classrooms after the performance and we ask parents to wait in the courtyard for their child to be handed over.
